First Things First Early Childhood Task Force

- First Things First convened a statewide Task Force to help set the strategic vision for the next 5 years.
- The Task Force recommended priority roles for FTF in the early childhood system at their meeting in January.
- From February through March, 3 committees of content experts in Children's Health, Family Support and Literacy, and Early Learning will convene to propose goals with identified measures for FTF that align with the priority roles.
- In April, the National Panel for Research and Evaluation will meet to review the goals and measures form each of the 3 committees
- So, by June, it is expected that a final 5 year strategic plan will be presented to the board.
