Reviewed website: much information for parents, Teachers, providers, etc. Public Service Campaign: Children Don't Know What They Don't See. Using a positive approach. Focus groups included parents, advisory board, and eye professionals; and were conducted in English, Spanish and Native languages. Parents showed a trust for their pediatricians, so there is a need for pediatricians to do the screening. Public Service channels: mobile & tablet apps; posters, ads, billboards & signs Connection to services: photo screening (Vitalyst Health Foundation), VSP (Vision Services Program), and Lions' Club. Needs/Assets Survey to community health services around the state. Funders to purchase equipment for them. VSP "Sights for Students" program now has an on-line app. School nurses and Lion's Club also have certificates. There will be a text project to contact parents regarding school screening and follow up. Three test sites so far (2 community health centers and 1 school district) will pilot it. Arizona is 48th in the Nation for Vision screening of 0-5 age group. Medical Claim data shows a 5% decrease in vision screening between 2013 and 2017. Arizona is also 1 of only 8 states that do not require vision screening for school age children. Arizona schools do it anyway, but it is not required at this time. Data Sharing Spreadsheet: Request was made for data sharing. No names; just numbers and percentages of vision screening and follow up. Members felt we could pull the information easily enough from our systems to provide the data via a spreadsheet that Chrisanda developed to help with the project. 	Chrisanda DeBois
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V.	2:15 Presentation	 Brush Up on Oral Health: Dental Hygiene Liaison project Dental Liaison Project Goal: Oral Health Education to Head Start from the National Center on Early Childhood Health & Wellness. Grant to Maternal & Child Oral Health Resource Center, to state and territorial dental directors, and to dental hygienist liaisons (one for Arizona). Role: link between hygienists and Head Start, collaborate, promote evidence based screening. If no resources, she can help link us up. NCECHW Topics: Oral Health Messages and Partnering with Parents. Newly approved: Dental Therapists by last year's legislation for high risk populations. They have the same role as a mid-level dentist; can provide mid-level extractions and dental care; they will refer to a dentist if advanced care is needed. Silver Diamine Fluoride Project: 4 year grant for a pilot project, then will report to AHCCCS. This product kills the cavity, so there is no need for dental procedure. It is used only if the care needed does not involve the root or pulp of the tooth. It costs approximately \$150 per bottle and can treat 15 teeth. They are currently looking for partners. Members can email Karen contacts for dental providers who would be willing to partner in this project.
