IV. Member Input	Start-up Updates from Programs – Lively discussions on the following items:  Programs are focusing on full enrollment – most report good enrollment, but not full enrolled yet. Some members were seeing influxes of application happening recently.  Concerns that programs will lose their Family Child Care providers because it's not financially feasible for them to work in the field.  Dealing with staff shortages – all members shared their challenges in this area and partners shared they were having struggles in their programs as well. Other staff are having to cover positions. ADE Staff spoke to us about their High Quality Early Learning (HQEL) grants which is helping for the next 2 years to increase funds for salaries and professional development. Inflation is an issue and the compensation being paid does not match education of staff.  Many programs are working on staff trainings for the new year.
