He served for 13 years and, in 2012, he co-founded a veteran-owned small business. He was elected to the House of Representatives in 2022. He lives in Oro Valley with his wife and two daughters.

- **Border control and immigration** → Deterring illegal immigration by various means, including building a wall
- **Veteran affairs** → Prioritizing care and resolve the homelessness crisis
- **Economic prosperity** → Supporting entrepreneurs by reducing taxes and regulations, supporting domestic energy production and reducing federal spending
- **Tribes** → Pushing back on federal bureaucratic overreach and giving tribes more discretion over how their land is used.

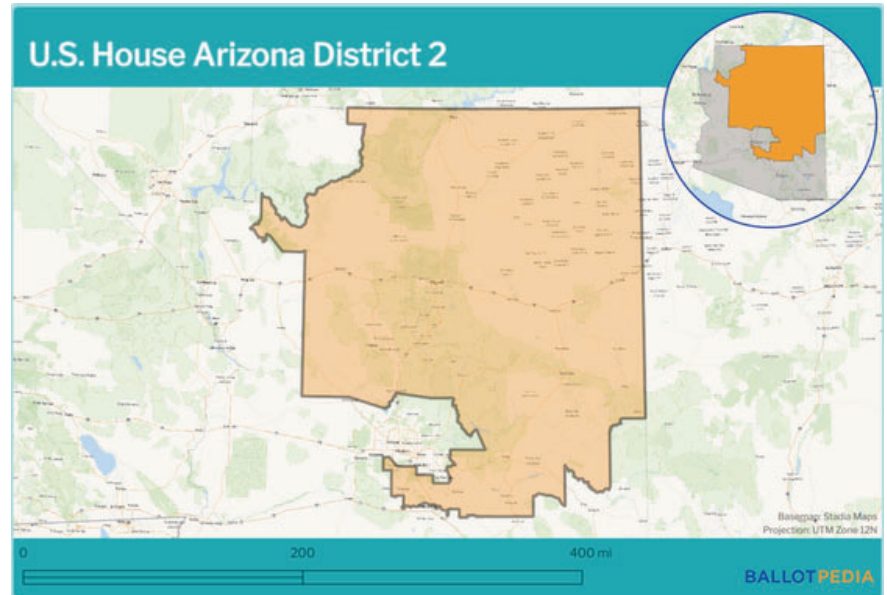
### Bills and Voting Records:

Crane has sponsored 22 pieces of legislation in the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress (2025-2026). His bills have focused on public lands and natural resources, armed forces and national security, international affairs, environmental protection, and transportation and public works.

## ARIZONA'S 2<sup>ND</sup> DISTRICT

Arizona's **2<sup>nd</sup> congressional district** is in the north eastern part of the state. The largest city in the district is Flagstaff. The district includes 12 Indian reservations including the Hualapai, Havasupai, Hopi, Navajo, San Carlos Apache, and White Mountain Apache peoples.



### Demographics:

- 853,900 people, 22% of whom are Native American
- 33,900 children under 5
- Median household income: \$70,400
- Families with income below the poverty level: 10%

### HEAD START FACTS - 7<sup>TH</sup> DISTRICT

- 90 programs in the district
- 343 preschool classroom teachers and assistant teachers working
- 2,832 families served
- 3,055 cumulative children enrolled
- 81% of families have received at least one service (housing assistance, mental health services, ESL training, assistance in enrolling into an education or job training program, etc)
- 167 families experiencing homelessness served
- \$58.9 million in funding (2024)
